# CCPA BOARD RATIFIES 2023 PRICE AGREEMENT

At their June 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting, the Association's Board of Directors ratified a 2023 price agreement reached with Pacific Coast Producers (the largest fruit canner in California). The 2023 Base Price is \$635/ton, up \$32/ton (5.3%) from last year's base price of \$603/ton. Up to 5% of No. 2 peaches in Extra Early varieties will be paid for at \$200/ton with No. 2's up to 3% paid for at \$200/ton for all other varietal groups. There will also be a 5% Constant Tolerance for general defects which will be paid at full price. PCP's fieldstaff encourages all growers to utilize the 5% green paid-for tolerance on all Ross and Late Ross deliveries in order to minimize any soft fruit issues at the plant. Following this action, Wawona Frozen Foods has also agreed to the same price and terms. The Association expects to reach an agreement with Del Monte Foods on the same price and terms of sale in the coming days. (Any Del Monte deliveries made before they have agreed to 2023 pricing will be paid using the 2022 harvest terms of sale with a payment equal to 75% of our three-year average price which results in a \$403.04/ton harvest payment.)

### 2023 BLOCK X BLOCK ESTIMATE TOTALS 212,333 TONS


The California League of Food Producers released the industry's 2023 Block X Block estimate of 212,333 tons on June 14<sup>th</sup>. The 2023 crop estimate (which represents a statewide average yield of 15.8 tons/acre) amounts to a 4% increase over last year's 204,440 ton crop. Our 2023 bearing acreage amounts to 13,424 acres which represents a 248 acre decrease from last year's bearing acreage. The projected 15.8 ton/acre average yield equals our previous five-year average yield.



## **CURRENT CROP CONDITIONS**

The 2023 peach harvest began in Kingsburg with one grower picking his American variety on June 13<sup>th</sup> which was seven days later than last year's initial harvest date. However, we do not believe this seven day difference in harvest timing is reflective of the entire crop but due more to this orchard having a light set this year. At this point, we expect that initial harvest dates for most growers will be approximately 10-14 days behind the 2022 harvest timing. Fruit sizing in all areas continues to be better than our 10-year average fruit sizing with relatively mild temperatures so far during the month of June.

## **EARLY FINAL PAYMENT PROGRAM AVAILABLE FOR 2023**

The Association will continue to offer our members the opportunity to participate in our Early Final Payment Program for 2023 crop deliveries. This program allows growers with cash contracts to receive \$158.75/ton on their 2023 deliveries prior to the scheduled October 1, 2023, final payment date. These accelerated payments will be made one week after the 75% harvest advance is paid by the processor and is subject to a \$2.50/ton interest charge. Growers with PCP Coop membership deliveries will have the opportunity to receive an early payment of PCP's three progress payments (February, April, and June of 2024) from CCPA one week after the 2023 delivery payment is made by PCP. Advance payment of PCP's three progress payments will be subject to an \$8.50/ton interest charge. Sign-ups for the 2023 Early Final Payment Program will be handled on a first come, first served basis.
